Limited Practice members x-ray machine operators are those who perform diagnostic x-ray procedures on selected anatomical sites and are registered or certified for limited practice by certification agencies recognized by the ASRT or hold a limited license in radiography under state statute not registered radiologic technologists. Imaging Assistant members are those who are registered or certified by certification agencies recognized by the ASRT as imaging assistants and are not radiologic technologists. They shall have all rights, privileges and obligations of Active members except to vote, hold office or serve as a delegate. Proviso: This amendment will not go into effect until March 31, 2027, and this proviso will be removed from the bylaws after that date.	Adopted as amended with more than 2/3 vote in the affirmative.
B-26.06	Amend Article XIII. Parliamentary Authority. Striking and inserting, A. The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised American Institute of Parliamentarians Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure, shall govern the ASRT in all cases in which they are applicable unless they are inconsistent with these Bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation, or state or federal law.
